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## What is Ticket to Work?

The Ticket to Work program provides beneficiaries with disabilities real choices in obtaining employment services and resources.

We will assist you in

- Making the choice that is right for you. Understanding the barriers to work and helping you overcome them. You have choices and can work full or part-time
- Accessing services and resources to find the job that is right for you
- Staying in control of your benefits
- Achieving greater personal satisfaction
- Taking advantage of the safety net. Easy transition back to benefits when and if needed



## What are Work Incentives?

Work incentives are special rules that make it possible for people with disabilities receiving Social Security Disability Insurance or Supplemental Security Income to explore work options and still receive benefits until they are able to support themselves. Work Incentives help beneficiaries with a disability remove barriers to work by

- Offering support services
- Providing a safety net
- Continued cash benefits for a time while you work
- Continued Medicare and Medicaid
- Help with education, training and rehabilitation to start a new line of work
- Medical reviews are waved while participating in the TTW program
- Entitlement to impairment related work expenses (e.g. transportation cost, medical devices, routine drug and medical services)

This ticket is issued to you by the Social Security Administration under the Ticket to Work and Self-Sufficiency Program. If you want help in returning to work or going to work for the first time, you may offer this ticket to an Employment Network of your choosing or take it to your State vocational rehabilitation agency for services. If you choose an Employment Network and it agrees to take your ticket, or if you choose your State agency and you qualify for services, those providers can offer you services to help you go to work.

An Employment Network provides the services at no cost to you. The Social Security Administration will pay the Employment Network if you assign your ticket to it, and the Employment Network helps you go to work and complies with other requirements of the Program. An Employment Network serving under the Program has agreed to abide by the rules and regulations of the Program under the terms of its agreement with the Social Security Administration for providing services under the Program. Your State agency can tell you about its rules for getting services.
